Information from Ray Campbell, Mine Operator

Mr Campbell operates New Jupiter Coal Company. Southeast corner, NW/4, NW/4, Sec. 16-65-1W.

Depth to top of coal in New Jupiter shaft was 32'. Mine originally was shaft mine, but has been changed to slope mine now, slope driven down to northeast. Has holed into Old Jupiter mine.

Mr. Campbell is interested in securing data on No. 5 coal in this area inasmuch as available No. 6 is almost exhausted. He has already pulled pillars in Old Jupiter and Browning mine. Says pillar coal in these mines still good and apparently not weathered.

Mine S - General Coal Report (0916.7g)

Mine R

Is an old local mine operated for many years but now abandoned, and location is destroyed by Scott Smith stripping. Depth to coal in this shaft was 38' to top, and averaged about 7' in thickness. Mr. Campbell could not remember name of mine or company operating.

Located south of railroad and about on section line. May be Sec. 17.
