Mississippian limestone in main stream north of land grant. Strike N75° E Dips 6° S

December 29, 1928

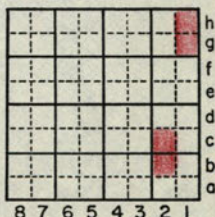
Along road north from Gall School first branch north of house on east side of road: Upstream (W) of road 100 yards

15"-18" white fossiliferous limestone apparently lying on clay. Think this is upper white limestone between coal 6 and coal 5 and that coal No.6 if present would be above. Altitude limestone about 550 estimate. McCabe says no exposure above - drift

Went down branch running north from BM 575 in SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Seems to be all drift to altitude 520 No outcrop but several large boulders of white limestone north of corner 575 at altitude about 550

Altitude Coal No.6 pretty close to 560 \pm ?

Coal in shaft North of Gall School cut out by pre-glacial valley
Coal 20' - Coal 550 \pm (540-50)
