Mine just north of Balk School. Shaft mine of New Hanover Coal Company (situated in Pennsylvanian outlier west of Waterloo anticline.

Mine not running and no data available as to depth, thickness, etc.

Around shaft many blocks of gray, rather nodular subcrystalline to dense limestone, fossiliferous, including some rather fat Fusulinas, probably Hanover or Brereton limestone.

Ravine north of mine walked about 1/2 mile, but no outcrops found.
