N1 Locality where small vein of coal has been worked in years past. Reported 18" thick, not exposed. Approximate elevation near pit where coal was dug. 493 A.T. Level.

N2 The wells in this vicinity will range from 9-13' to rock is the opinion of one of the men living here. There is a decided difference in the character of the surface deposits on the hill from that of the surface deposits on the plain to the west and north. Here the till is full of pebbles coarser and inclined somewhat to be red. There is practically none of the gray - almost colorless surface deposit. On the plain this surface deposit will range from 0-3' or 4' in thickness having a sort of dead gray color. At places this deposit is lacking, the hard pan comes clear up to the surface. The boundary between the plain - a lowland flat and the upland will be somewhere between the 420 contour and the 440.
