Upper branches of hollow in the NE/4 of section 17. Numerous old mine dumps of No. 4 Coal were spotted on the map.

- 2h In bed of creek a fresh-water limestone of No. 5 was seen. The limestone was apparently almost in place. A short distance down the hollow.
 - 2' Gray mudstone was exposed in creek bank. Orbiculoidea was found in the mudstone.
- 3h West bank of hollow about 200 yards west of above hollow mouth.
 - 4' Fine grained dirty somewhat massive sandstone was seen. This sandstone is the Pleasantview.

 Note: No. 4 Coal was not exposed in the above section yet, cannel coal was found in dump which is present above No. 4. Also the relation of the mudstone to the Pleasantview sandstone would leave little doubt as to correlation.

Along branch running W. from NE corner, Section 17.
No outcrop except drift until get down to about 580'.
Here find outcrop of Fresh Water limestone, also one of large concretions found associated with #4. Several mine dumps in immediate vicinity mainly on sides of one hill between two ravines

Base of till pretty close to 580' so rock cover above coal not thick.

draining from east.

This general relationship suggests that this is No. 4. Coal apparently has a black slate roof with large black limestone concretions.

(2117.7h) Cady and Parks June 25. 1941

No. 4 coal has been stripped in a small way in the bottom of the valley. The coal is very poor.

No. 5 coal has been and is being mined at a number of places. The mine at 2108 has been abandoned and another mine is operating on E. side of the valley about 100 yards N. of the section line.
