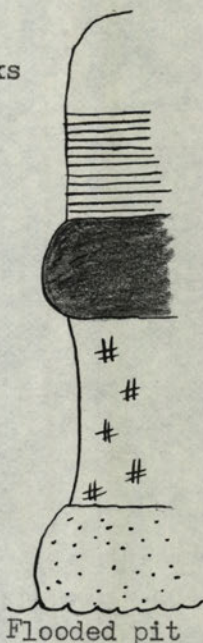

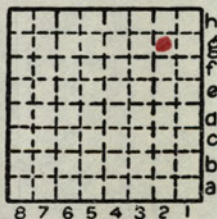

South of road, strip pit get coal about 400.
Probably . Sandstone dips north, with shale below
and under that black slate. No coal 40".

The soapstone is about 6' thick. Black slate
3'. Upwards soapstone changes into sandy shale
and then sandstone- about 8 feet above coal.
Sandstone slabby

At pit NW/4, NW/4, Sec.21 The upper coal lies
close above this sandstone which is apparently
not more than 5' thick. The upper coal is separated
from the cap rock sandstone by about 5 to 6 feet
soapstone. Coal not well exposed.
