August 19, 1933

East slope of Hunting Branch, up a small gully on
slope.

Several coal entries in working condition, but
none operating at time of visit. Section shows
Sandstone, light gray, fine grained, dense, slightly
micaceous in beds 2-6" thick 5'
Unconformity with unevenness up to 1'
Shale, medium gray, soft, with abundant leaf, stem
impressions, especially Cordaites 1'3"-2'3",
variation due to unconformity

→ Coal, good and hard 10 1/2-11", probably thicker
back in mine. could not locate ^{DKL 7/1/86}

Medium blue gray hard underclay 2' seen at entry
Concealed 20'

In gully below

Sandstone, thin bedded, interbedded with sandy
shale 4'

Concealed 15' to Hunting Branch.

1. Old small coal opening above thin bedded sandstone
extensively exposed in bed of hollow and
along road to west.

This sandstone probably lies close above Upper
Conglomerate and may even grade downward into it.
