Working coal mine with 57' shaft from ground level of 745'-750'. Shaft runs down to coal #6 which would have an elevation of near 690'-695'. Coal seam is 4'8" thick here at the Brandt Mine. Coal shown both the basal clay 12" band and the 3" blue band of clay.

August 26, 1935 Brandt Mine

Workings only run 60 yards to north of shaft. Used to be an old mine at corner north of here. Worked to SW mostly.

One mile east of here (and 1 mile north) 160 rods used to be 3 old shafts about 50' deep. North shaft followed coal right to outcop.

(Note. This location is probably in section 29. R.V.2/67)

No coal north of next road running E-W across Indian Hill. Not more than $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ mile at most. (Note this is probably the road in south part of section 21, this township. R.V. 2/67)

No coal west of gravel road to Mineral. (Note. There is no indication of which gravel road was meant. R.V. 2/67)

No. 7 coal in Brandt shaft.
