It has a double hoisting shaft, a pump shaft, and an escapement shaft situated forty feet from the hoisting shaft. Sufficient hose is kept on the surface, near the pumps, to extinguish fire in any of the buildings. Length of main entry is four hundred and fifty yards. Four cents per bushel is paid for mining, and mules are used for hauling out coal to the cage."
