March 11, Ray Flowers, triprider, age 19 years, single, was killed in No. 1 mine, Bell and Zoller Coal and Mining Company, when he fell off bumper and was dragged under car.

March 18, Oran Maclin, miner, age 31 years, married, Harvey Greenwood, miner, age not given, married, Jack Greenwood, machine man, age 41 years, married, and Thomas Gleghorn, motorman, age 28 years, married, were killed in Valier Coal Company's mine, by an explosion of gas. The first three were almost instantly killed; Gleghorn lived 'till April 12. Maclin leaves a widow and one child, Harvey Greenwood leaves a widow and one child, Jack Greenwood a widow and four children, and Gleghorn leaves a widow.

April 5, Mike Poma, loader, age 42 years, single, was run over by pit cars and killed in C. W. & F. Coal Company's No. 1 mine.

April 10, Frank Meyer, trackman, age 50 years, married, was caught between a pit car and the coal face and killed, in Brewerton Coal Company's No. 22 mine. He leaves a widow and two children.

April 26, Crate Cagle, trackman, age 56 years, married, was killed by a fall of coal in Franklin County Coal Company's No. 5 mine. He leaves a widow.

April 29, Harry Mitchell, laborer, age 20 years, single, was run over by railway cars and killed, at C. W. & F. Coal Company's No. 1 mine.

May 3, Harrison Finney, miner, age 42 years, married, was killed by a fall of rock in Franklin County Coal Company's No. 5 mine. He leaves a widow and six children.

June 24, William Sweetin, laborer, age 42 years, married, was killed in C. W. & F. Coal Company's No. 1 mine. He leaves a widow.

August 7, Charles Holmes, loader, age 53 years, married, was killed by a fall of face coal in Peabody Coal Company's No. 19 mine. He leaves a widow and one child.

August 29, Elmer Stanley, loading machine operator, age 23 years, single, was killed by a fall of coal in Valier Coal Company's mine.

September 10, Andy Rogers, loading machine man, age 30 years, married, was killed in C. W. & F. Coal Company's No. 2 mine by a fall of coal knocking him against the machine with such force as to cause his death in about twenty minutes. He leaves a widow and four children.

September 27, Fred Flannagan, machine helper, age 29 years, married, died from injuries received three days earlier when struck by a jack-pipe, fracturing his skull. He leaves a widow.

October 8, W. H. Meyers, electrician, age 35 years, single (divorced) was killed by pit cars in Brewerton Coal Company's No. 21 mine. He leaves four dependent children.

November 16, Thomas Watson, miner, age 55 years, married, died from injuries received three days earlier, by a premature shot, in Chicago, Wilmington and Franklin Coal Company's No. 2 mine. He leaves a widow and four children.

December 5, James R. Struger, motorman, age 35 years, married, was killed in Bell and Zoller Coal Company's No. 1 mine. Deceased either jumped or was thrown from the cab, going under the motor.
