

September 6, David McNeill, loading machine helper, age 37 years, married, died from injuries sustained August 31st, by a fall of coal in Brewerton Coal Company's No. 22 mine. He leaves a widow and three children.

September 28, John Boggio, machine runner, age 38 years, married, died from injuries received February 21, by a fall of coal in Old Ben Coal Corporation's No. 15 mine. Deceased had finished cutting his room and knocking out jack pipe, which had been set on some loose coal; the coal fell, breaking his back. He leaves a widow and three children.

October 1, Anton Bondi, loader, age 42 years, married, was killed in Bell & Zollar Coal & Mining Company's No. 1 mine by a fall of rock. He leaves a widow and two children.

October 5, Tony Otwrik, triprider, age 26 years, single, was caught between car and motor and crushed to death in Brewerton Coal Company's No. 22 mine.

October 16, U. G. Hodgson, loader, age 58 years, single, was killed by a fall of rock in Peabody Coal Company's No. 18 mine.

October 14, L. F. Casey, miner, age 56 years, married, was killed in Franklin County Coal Company's No. 5 mine by a fall of coal. He leaves a widow and six children.

November 2, Peter Bondolli, loader, age 46 years, widower, was killed by a fall of coal in Old Ben Coal Corporation's No. 8 mine. He leaves one child.

November 9, August Cavillo, machine man, age 37 years, married, was killed in Bell & Zollar Mining Company's No. 1 mine, by a fall of coal. He leaves a widow.

December 1, at 2:30 a. m., an explosion of gas occurred in No. 8 mine, Old Ben Coal Corporation, causing the death of seven men.

December 2, Peter Ponzi, loader, age 66 years, widower, died from injuries received August 9, in Old Ben Coal Corporation's No. 8 mine. Deceased was loading coal when some coal fell, and, in getting out of the way of the fall, he fell down. He was not struck, and resumed his work. He became dizzy and then unconscious, was taken out of the mine, and then to a hospital in St. Louis, where he died.

December 3, Mike Sessock, machine runner, age 37 years, married, died from injury received the day before by a fall of coal in Old Ben Coal Corporation's No. 14 mine. He leaves a widow and four children.
