Page two Wednesday August 17, 1932

Spillerton Coal and Coke Company - mining No. 5 coal 4' thick 100' to coal. No. 6 coal found at 42' -8'6" thick.

## Whiteside Mine

450' south of Spillerton shaft, small shaft mine Wagon trade

31' to coal, 8' of coal - have about three acres of of coal to dia

Wilson Mine - shaft mine at brow of hill Sec. 1-9S-2E Mining No. 6 coal - 45' to base of coal - coal 7' average.

Located 200' west of Central aand Eastern Railroad at brow of hill flat on top and sloping south and west.

Harry Jette Mine shaft mine to No.6 coal Sec. 1-9S-2E Located 210' west of railroad and 310 north of road running west from Spillerton through middle of Sec. 6.

Depth to top of coal - 62', thickness 8' Old shaft located in sinkhole about 75' west of new shaft also owned by Harry Jette. Sinkhole due to collapsed of room in old Goodall mine.

In addition to the mines described there are several old mines in areas between the hard road and the Central and Illinois tracks.
