Outcrop in right bank of creek 40' long and 3' thick; water level to 3' above.

Shale, light brown, silty, micaceous. Many loose blocks of hard calcareous sandstone, probably not far from in place. Estimated elevation water level 595'.

Went up stream 2300' (NNW). With the exception of the first 200' bed of creek seems to be in till and stream deposits all the way. Numerous slabs and blocks of limestone in stream drift.

Talked with two nativeswho report numerous coal diggings. One of these is said to be in W. bank of creek just traversed in the NE/4 of NW/4 of section 34. Also there are some to the S. on Andrew's land in Greene County O2O4, NW/4. They say coal outcrops S. of bridge along creek in section 34.

250' SSE of bridge peculiar relations were observed between shale and hard rock.
