July 2, 1928

NE/4 NE/4 Sec.26 T16N-R6E Well in yard. 45' to coal - $4\frac{1}{2}$ ' thick. Shale cover. Old mine shaft 40' to coal. 100 yards south of house on crest. 42' coal.

NE/4 NW/4 Sec. 26 T16N R6E Abandoned shaft on ridge southeast of house. 41' to coal - 42' thick. Shale cover. 2 acre mined out. Coal runs out to NE of shaft 200 yards. 11' to coal near north-south hedge in bottom to east of house. No coal in bottom along creek.





Sprague Farm. One well at house 35' to coal. Well near road 10' to coal. Old mine shaft on side of ridge west of house 40' to coal. Air shaft 1/8 mile south of old shaft 65' to coal. Ten acres mined out in NW corner.

NW/4 NE/4 Sec. 27 T16N R6E.

Old mine on ridge 200 yards south of road. Open pit for fireclay. Thin coal 24" 5' deep. Fireclay below.
