Dip 7°, N 25°E. in thin-bedded sandstone beside road.

Elevation 480' (corrected).)

Near SE corner NE/4 NE/4, Section 24. Trounell's*

Mine. Dip 1°, N 30°E. Coal with slaty shale

roof, resembles Baggs. Elevation 460' (corrected.)

(0924 NE/4)

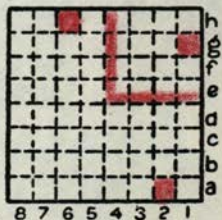
Chaney's coal bank, 3'4", 500' NW. of center NE/4,

Section 24. A little N. of middle E. and W. line.

Same coal very low dip. Elevation 420' (corrected)

Another entry 100 yards W.

Another bank 1000' N. of house on Irwin land about
near NW corner NE/4 NW/4, Section 24.Irwin says another coal 15' to 25' above with shale
parting 3½' of coal.(* Could not make out Brokaw's writing for sure, so this is a

July 21, 1916

3'6" coal being worked on Erwin land in SE corner of NW/4 of Section 24.

The coal is overlain by 2'6" of black shale which in turn is overlain by X' of gray shale.

15' to 25' above this coal another coal seam 3'6" thick is found. This coal has slate partings and a sandstone roof. At present it is not worked. The coal is reported to be of inferior quality.

The coal which is worked is apparently the same seam which is mined in open pits SW of Carrier Mills.

The two coals probably correspond to the No. 2 of northern Illinois.

The coal has very gentle dip S 25°W.
