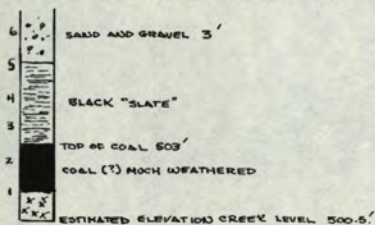

September 10, 1927

Went NE. across fields to bridge at 0120.67f - 2200'.  
Knobby limestone outcrops at creek level to 1'  
above. 4' mostly hidden. Upper 2' light grey,  
fire-clay, coal 28". Black slate 4' on top of coal.  
600' W. of bridge - **bank mine - active**. Miner claims  
only 24" **Hasencamp Mine**. Workings go 200' back  
in bank. Dip to N. reported.

2560' along Mauvaise Terre, 1500' outcrop Knobby in  
bed. Outcrop in steep N-facing bank; coal and  
shale; Knobby limestone in creek bed.

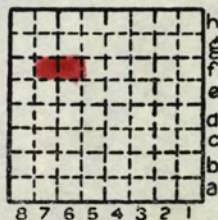
1100' N. outcrop 75' long; black shale. W.-facing  
bank 10<sup>35</sup>' dip to N. in direction N 10° E.



Exposure at S. end of outcrop.

450' N. outcrop coal 15" underlain by 10" light grey  
fireclay in small creek.

For next 800' shale (black, grey and yellow) with some  
resistant beds, limestone ? or sandstone. Stream  
confluence 50' shale section in bank to E. Shale  
to head of creek and in next draw to W.
