Mr. Claude Heaton, retired farmer now living in Manchester, owns the farm adjacent to the mine described by J. A. Harrison in 1941. Mr. Heaton said the mine shaft was sunk in about 1930 to a depth between 60 to 70 feet where a 14 inch vein of coal was encountered. The mine was never worked and was abandoned shortly after the coal was reached.

Mr. Fulton Cuddy, now deceased, owned the farm and was apparently active in the mine organization. A Mr. Harris, not a resident of Manchester, operated the mine.

Mr. Heaton did not believe any drilling exploration preceded the sinking of the shaft.

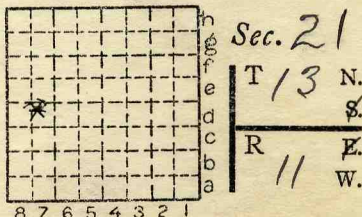
