




First took lower 3 feet coal then took up to the slab rock

300 feet south escape shaft about 20 feet instead of 15 feet above the coal otherwise the same no water below the hard fluid rock 2 barrels a day dry times more


2 or 3 acres ruined shaft is filled up now Could mine all the coal now
