

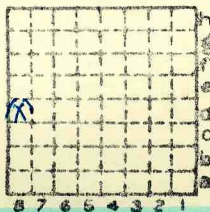

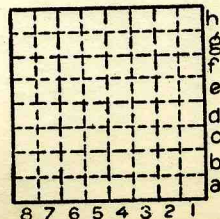
CHESTERFIELD COAL AND MINING Co.

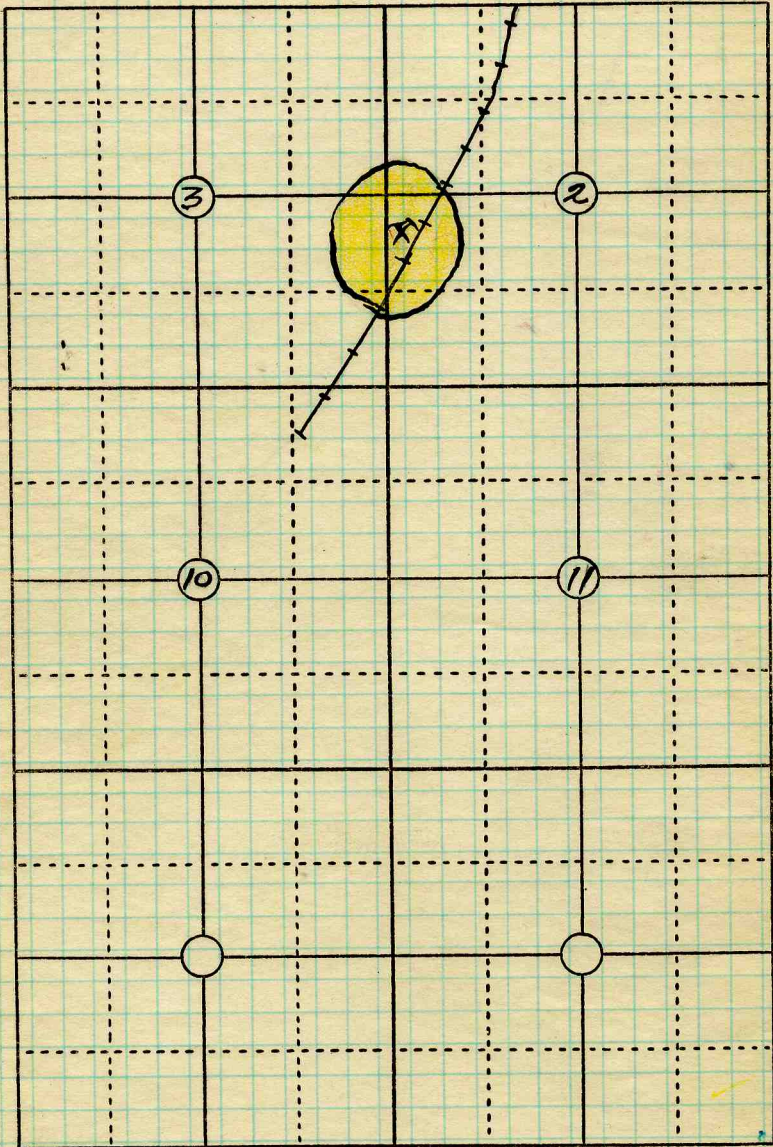

CHESTERFIELD COAL AND MINING Co.

During the year this company has sunk an escapement shaft which is just finished. Ladders will be put in and a ventilating fan erected at the escapement shaft. This is a long-wall mine. The coal seam is 2 feet 10 inches in thickness, of a very good quality. If water could be got at the mine this coal could be manufactured into a fair article of coke. Owing to the receivers of the Wabash system having taken some of the trains off the road, very little business has been done at the mine during the year.

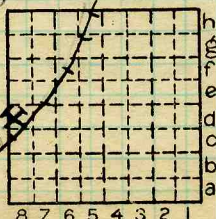

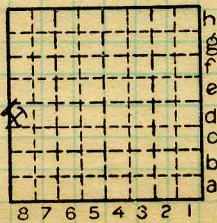
