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Data on No. 5 coal

C.M. Bridy's local mine No. 6 southwest corner, NW/4, NW/4,

Working pending settlement in new wage scale.

Depth to top of coal at slope 47', thickness 8'

Have about 4 or 5 acres of solid coal in areas between old Peabody No. 2 and Peabody No. 3.

Watson Mine No. 1 - Skaggs Coal Co. Laclide, Sincerity, Etc.

110' to top of No. 5 coal, 4'+ thickness.

Have not worked since February 1931.

Have about 450 acres of No. 5 left.

Shipping Mine in No. 5 coal - Britian Coal Co

Located on west side of C.B. & Q. Railroad and north of coal belt railroad in Sec. 33-8S-2E

None around so information on depth of coal, etc. not obtained.

City Lake Coal Company Sec. 4-9S-2E

Slope mine to No.5 coal

Depth to top of coal at mouth of slope = 46'

Coal averages 4' thick level and good mining but quite dirty.

Capacity about 250 tons per day.

Shipping all coal by rail Missouri P. and C.B. & Q. Railroad.

Employs about 55 men regularly.
