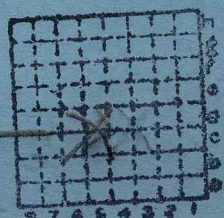

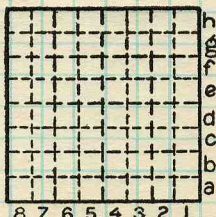

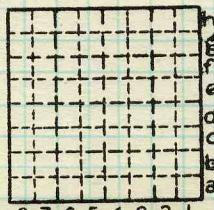

"H. and V. Pit No. 1"

The Mined-Out Area Map shows a mine with an indefinite boundary, labelled "H. and V. Coal Co. Pit No. 1" in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 11, T. 10S- R. 7E, Salt County. This is now a level pasture and, if this was a strip mine, it has the best job of reclamation I have ever seen. There are no signs of any tipple, footings, machinery, gob pile, or other indications of underground mining either. It is possible that the No. 5 or No. 6 Coal was mined underground, but no field evidence exists of a mine.
